

# Humid Subtropical Climate

The seasons in Hong Kong and Macau are quite similar due to their geographical proximity.

#### SPRING (March to May)

Mild, pleasant temperatures, around 18-25°C. This is a transitional period, sometimes wet with light rain.

#### SUMMER (June to August)

Hot and humid, with temperatures ranging from 26°C to 32°C, often higher due to humidity. Typhoon season, with intense storms and rain.

#### AUTUMN (September to November)

Cooler, more pleasant temperatures (20-28°C). With fewer typhoons and less rain, this is often the most pleasant period.

#### WINTER (December to February)

Cool, but rarely cold, with temperatures around 12°C and 18°C. Temperatures may fall a little lower, but the weather remains generally dry.



**Best time to travel**: Between October and December, with pleasant weather, fewer typhoons and clear/sunny skies.








Hong Kong International Airport (HKG), also known as Chek Lap Kok, is one of Asia's largest and most modern air hubs. Located on a man-made island, it is a major transit center linking Asia to the rest of the world. Designed by architect Norman Foster, it is renowned for its efficiency, ultramodern infrastructure and top-of-the-range services. It welcomes tens of millions of passengers every year and boasts a wide range of stores, restaurants and lounges. Accessible via the Airport Express (metro), it offers a rapid transfer to the city center in just 24 minutes.



#### **Direct Destinations**











When visiting **Hong Kong**, a variety of efficient means of transport are available:

MTR (Mass Transit Railway): The Hong Kong metro is fast, reliable and covers the entire territory, including the airport and some islands.

**Bus**: A vast network of double-decker buses and minibuses lets you explore areas not served by the MTR, including the New Territories.

**Tramways**: The double-decker streetcars, nicknamed "Ding Ding", run on Hong Kong Island and offer an authentic and affordable experience.

Taxis: Available in three colors (red for the island and Kowloon, green for the New Territories, blue for Lantau Island), they are affordable and practical.

**Ferries**: The Star Ferry connects Hong Kong Island with Kowloon, offering magnificent views over the bay. Other ferries serve neighboring islands such as Lantau, Lamma and Cheung Chau.

Ngong Ping 360 Cable Car: Ideal for reaching the Big Buddha on Lantau Island while enjoying panoramic views.

#### Gastronomy in Hong Kong: A Journey of the Senses between Tradition and Modernity

A true gourmet's paradise, Hong Kong is a culinary capital where Chinese, Asian and Western influences mingle. From local stalls to Michelin-starred restaurants, the city offers both refined and popular cuisine, reflecting its history and cultural diversity. From the famous **dim sum** tasted in a teahouse to savory **Cantonese roasts**, **Wonton noodles** and seafood, each dish tells a part of the city's soul.

#### Some Emblematic Dishes:

<u>Dim Sum</u> – Small steamed bites (with shrimp, pork...), fried or baked).

<u>Peking Duck</u> – Une spécialité hongkongaise prisée.

<u>Wonton Noodles</u> – Thin noodles served in a fragrant broth, garnished with shrimp and pork ravioli.

<u>Pineapple Brioche</u> – A sweet brioche bun that contains no pineapple, but owes its name to its golden, cracked crust reminiscent of pineapple skin.









#### **Direct Destinations**













When visiting Macau, there are several means of transport available to get around easily:

note: Macau's compact historic center lends itself well to strolls, particularly to explore the picturesque alleyways and UNESCO-listed monuments.

**Public Buses**: A dense, cost-effective network lets you travel between the various districts and attractions of Macau, Taipa and Coloane.

**☐ Taxis**: Affordable and practical, they are a good way to get around, although sometimes hard to find at peak times.

**Ferries**: Ferries run between Macau and Hong Kong in around an hour, with frequent departures day and night.

Helicopter: A fast, luxurious option for reaching Hong Kong in just 15 minutes.

**Bicycle Rental (Coloane and Taipa):** Ideal for a leisurely stroll through traditional villages and along the seafront.







#### **Macau Gastronomy: A Delicious Blend of Cultures**

Macau, a former Portuguese enclave in China, offers a unique cuisine fusing Asian and European flavors. #### **// Some Emblematic Dishes:**

<u>Pastel de nata</u> – Small cream tarts inherited from the Portuguese influence. <u>Bacalhau</u> – Salted codfish dish.

<u>Macau Curry</u> – A typical dish influenced by Indian and Portuguese spices and often prepared with pork, chicken or seafood.
