

Main Spots to Visit in Cambodia

Banlung

Banlung is a small northern city that will delight nature seekers with its vast forests and numerous waterfalls. Travelers can also enjoy the opportunity to meet ethnic minority farmers working in this large farmland.

Battambang

Battambang, the second largest city in Cambodia, holds a unique charm thanks to its colonial buildings and different monuments scattered throughout the city, making it a renowned destination. The city is known for its beautiful landscapes and authentic surroundings.

Kampot

Kampot, the main city of the province, overlooks the Gulf of Thailand. It is the ideal spot to visit the Bokor National Park, relax on Kep Beach, or discover the wonderful Koh Tonsay, also known as the "Rabbit Island."

Kompong Cham

Located along the Mekong River, this charming and peaceful town has successfully preserved its colonial heritage. The area is also home to the Wat Nokor Temple, renowned for its Aspara sculptures, and the Cham minority villages, the third largest ethnic group in Cambodia.

Kompong Chnang

Located in the center, at the edge of the Tonle Sap River, this small village has grown around a large fishing port. Often used as a stopover for boats cruising the river, Kompong Chnang is an ideal spot to spend the night in a relaxed atmosphere.

Kompong Thom

This authentic region, situated in the center of Cambodia, features one of the most important cultural heritages of the country. Among them are Phum Prasat and Sambor Prei Kuk, which contain over a hundred pre-Angkorian temples hidden deep within the jungle.

Kratie

Situated 250 km north of Phnom Penh, this authentic region offers stunning landscapes between the banks of the Mekong River and expansive rice fields. It is home to some freshwater dolphins, which can often be seen at sunset.

Monduliri

Monduliri is likely the most unique province in Cambodia thanks to its low population density, spectacular nature, and the ethnic groups and tribes who reside there. The region is also famous for vigorous waterfalls, wooded hills, and pine forests that can be explored on an elephant for an unusual journey.

Phnom Penh

Nestled majestically at the confluence of the mighty Mekong and Tonle Sap rivers, Cambodia's capital still retains its undeniable charm, with its wide tree-lined boulevard and French colonial buildings. Reflecting on its colonial past, Phnom Penh stands as a true oasis of peace, making it well worth a visit.

Poipet

Poipet, a border city between Cambodia and Thailand, is a usual destination for circuits going from Phnom Penh to Bangkok. Its geographical location has contributed to its fast development, creating an original and exciting journey.

Preah Vihear

Ratanakiri

This isolated and rustic province is located north of Phnom Penh and boasts different natural sites with various fauna (parrots, elephants...) and flora. In addition to these treasures, the region is also home to several traditional Kroeung villages.

Sambor Prei Kuk

Located 176 km east of Angkor, Sambor Prei Kuk is one of Cambodia's many archaeological sites and one of the most fascinating. The Khmer architecture, along with its specific decorative details, is rich in history and worth discovering.

Siem Reap (Angkor)

The ancient capital of the Khmer Empire, the vast Angkor complex is one of the most beautiful archaeological and architectural sites in the world. A mixture of stone structures and jungles, the Angkor Temples have retained all their beauty and continue to stand as a testament to the grandeur of the Khmer Empire.

Sihanoukville

Located in the southeast of Cambodia, along-the Gulf of Thailand, Sihanoukville is the only maritime port of Cambodia. This small, green, and hilly city features beautiful white sand beaches and crystal-clear waters. Sihanoukville and its surrounding islands make a perfect stop for a beach holiday.

Tonle Bati
