

Main Spots to Visit in Hong Kong and Macau

HONG KONG

Big Buddha (Tian Tan Buddha) & Po Lin Monastery

Located on Lantau Island, the Big Buddha is one of the world's largest outdoor seated Buddha statues. You can reach it by the scenic Ngong Ping 360 Cable Car, which offers stunning views of the island.

Hong Kong Museum of History

To dive deeper into Hong Kong's past, the Hong Kong Museum of History offers fascinating exhibits on the region's cultural, political, and natural history.

Lantau Island

Aside from the Big Buddha, Lantau Island offers hiking trails, beautiful beaches, and the peaceful Tai O fishing village, where you can experience traditional stilt houses and seafood delicacies.

Temple Street Night Market

Explore the lively Temple Street Night Market, where you can shop for souvenirs, clothes, electronics, and enjoy local street food. It's a vibrant spot to experience Hong Kong's bustling night scene.

Tsim Sha Tsui Promenade

Stroll along the Tsim Sha Tsui Promenade for stunning views of Victoria Harbour. The Avenue of Stars is a tribute to Hong Kong's film industry, with handprints of famous stars and sculptures that celebrate its cinematic legacy.

Victoria Peak

For the best panoramic views of Hong Kong's skyline, Victoria Peak is a must-visit. Take the famous Peak Tram to the top, where you can enjoy spectacular views of the city, the harbor, and surrounding islands.

MACAU

A-Ma Temple

Ruins of St. Paul's

Senado Square

Senado Square is the heart of the historic center of Macau. The square features beautiful Portuguese-style buildings and is a great place to explore on foot, surrounded by shops, cafes, and historical architecture.

Taipa Village

Taipa Village is a charming area offering a mix of traditional Chinese and Portuguese architecture. Wander through narrow streets lined with old houses, visit the Taipa Houses-Museum, and enjoy the local food, especially the famous Portuguese (Pastel de nata).
