

Main Spots to Visit in Laos

Champassak

Located along the Mekong River in Southern Laos, Champassak is a former royal city founded by the Emperor of the same name. This charming city is a mix of ancient colonial buildings and traditional Laotian houses. Its biggest attraction is the Vat Phou Temple, one of the most revered temples in Laos.

Hinboun

The Nam Hinboun River and its surrounding villages offer wonderful spots to explore limestone caves and wild flora. Situated alongside a river and mountain, Hinboun is an ideal destination for hiking and trekking adventures.

Houei Say

Muang La

Pakse & Boloven Plateau

Located in Southern Laos in Champassak Province, Pakse is the second largest city of Laos after Vientiane. Plain of jars
